

Medical Director (Psychiatric)--Career Medical Director needed to assume all duties and responsibilities necessary for the coordination of effective and efficient psychiatric services to the clients of Heartland Human Services. The Medical Director shall be responsible for the overall quality of psychiatric care provided to the clients of the agency. Participate as an active member of the treatment team in staff meetings and case reviews of mental health and substance abuse clients. Provide professional consultation to the staff. Provide individual and family therapy as needed to meet the needs of assigned clients. Prescribe medication as needed, monitor possible side effects of medication and provide education on side effects to clients. Maintain a level of professionalism with clients in order to foster a healthy, non-dependent therapeutic relationship. Conduct in-service training(s) for agency staff as assigned by the Executive Director. Assist agency clients in accessing other services of the agency. Assist agency clients in accessing the services of other community agencies, programs and services. Be responsible for maintaining communication with other physicians in the community, particularly primary care physicians who provide medical services to clients and complete all necessary documentation for services performed for each client. Requirements: Must hold a valid and unlimited physicians license issued by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation to practice medicine in the state of Illinois. Must be certified in psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology or be Board-eligible. Minimum of five years experience in providing psychiatric care is desired. Must be knowledgeable and proficient in the use of the DSM-IV. Must be knowledgeable and proficient in the use of CPT codes and medical billing. Must be knowledgeable of current trends in psychiatric treatment. Must be knowledgeable of current medications; the indications for use; expected effects and possible side effects. Must have necessary skills to provide professional consultation to agency staff. Must pass a background check meeting the requirements of the Illinois Healthcare Worker. Must maintain membership in good standing on the courtesy staff of St. Anthony's Memorial Hospital. Must maintain a valid DEA number. Must be eligible to participate in the Medicaid and Medicare programs. Must be eligible for professional liability insurance. Must possess a valid driver's license, automobile insurance, and automobile for use on the job. Must practice at assigned locations as determined by Heartland Human Services. Shall be capable of maintaining a flexible work schedule to meet the needs of the position.
